- 32,000 km (20,000 miles) track
- 30,000 bridges, tunnels and viaducts
- Over 1 billion passenger journeys
- 5745 level crossings
- 1386 level crossings closed
- 130 level crossing managers











Our Statistics - Fatalities








Our Statistics - Near Misses








Risk Management









- Risk assess each individual crossing
- The frequency of re-assessment should be guided by the risk at each crossing
- Look beyond the level crossing
- Think like the user
